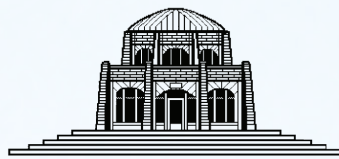

## Waterfalls of the Columbia Gorge

## Cascade Locks

Home of Sternwheeler Columbia Gorge, Bridge of the Gods, Bonneville Hatchery, and Dry Creek Falls, the small town of Cascade Locks is often referred to as the "heart of the Columbia River Gorge" and is located 27 miles east of Vista House. ([cascadelocks.com](http://cascadelocks.com))



## Bonneville Fish Hatchery

Take I-84 E from Vista House to exit 40. Oregon Dept. of Fish and Wildlife's largest hatchery with display ponds of trout and salmon and a special sturgeon underwater viewing area. ## Bonneville Dam

## Hood River Fruit Loop

## Timberline Lodge
